April 3: Dealing with Anger, Ours and That of Others - Rev. Charles J. Stephens We don't always deal well with emotions, especially when the emotion is anger. In some instances, anger can be a healthy reaction but it can also be problematic, both when internalized and when expressed in destructive actions. The covid pandemic and political unrest of the last several years has left our country and world deeply divided. Is it possible to maintain a circle where we can listen and reason with one another in a world filled with agitation, change and danger?

Charles Stephens, Minister Emeritus of the UU Congregation in Washington Crossing in Titusville, NJ and also of the UU Congregation in Ellsworth, ME. Early in his ministry he trained in hospital chaplaincy. He and Alison, his wife, moved to Blue Hill, ME in 2012 when he retired. As a side endeavor, he and Alison have a large garden, cut and process their firewood, do various building projects on their forested land and rent out two seasonal cabins which they built on their property.

During sabbaticals, Charles studied in Oxford, England, studied with Matthew Fox at the University of Culture and Creation Spirituality in California, traveled to Israel and Palestine with an Interfaith Compassionate Listening group, and trained with the Shalem Institute for Spiritual Guidance & Direction.

April 17: Easter Sunday Flower Ceremony - Gail Karlsson

Gail Karlsson will lead a ceremony giving thanks for these gifts from nature that sustain and delight us. Attendees are invited to bring flowers, plants or cuttings from their yard and exchange them with other members, describing why the plants have special significance for them and/or the community.

The flower ceremony was introduced in 1923 by Norbert Capek, who founded the Unitarian Church in Czechoslovakia, as a symbolic ritual that would bind people more closely together, based on the natural beauty of their shared world.

Gail Karlsson is an environmental lawyer, writer and photographer, and a member of the UU Fellowship of St. John. She is the author of *The Wild Life in an Island House*, plus the guide book *Learning About Trees and Plants - A Project of the Unitarian Universalist Fellowship of St. John*, and writes a column on Connecting with Nature for the online *Virgin Islands Islands Source*.
